
MENTORING

Peer Tutoring

Grade 11 & 12 students enrolled in peer tutoring attend Grades 8 – 10 classes to support younger students with academics & behaviour expectations.

Peer Mentoring

Older students spend time one-on-one with younger students who need academic or social emotional support. Often, these relationships are quite empowering for both parties.

Athletics Support

Students support athletics by assistant coaching younger students and helping officiate and/or managing equipment at tourpaments.

Often supported by Youth Care Workers, students work together on various topics to encourage success, improve self-esteem and self-confidence.
