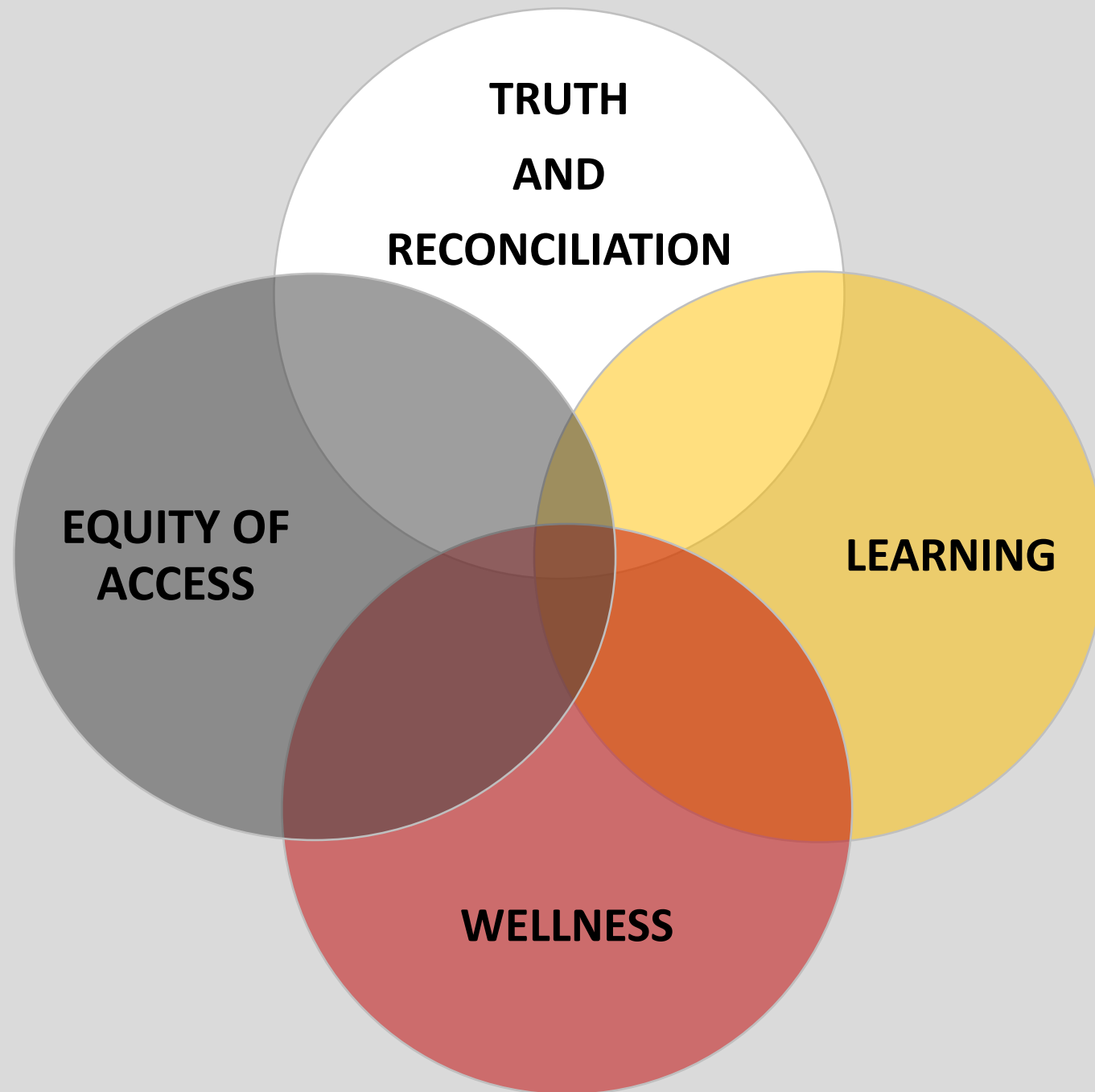

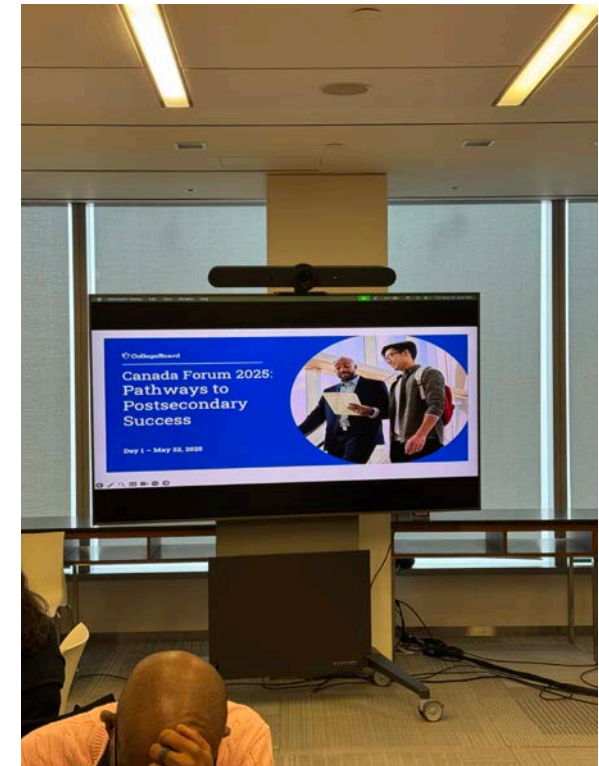

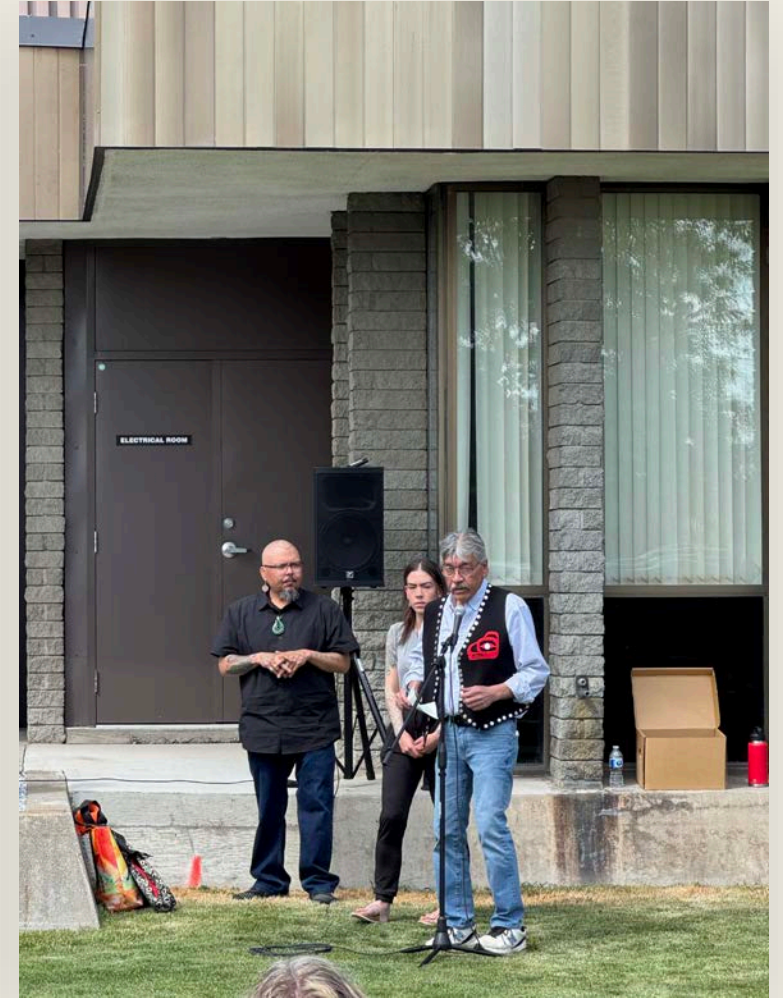

Post-Secondary Transitions

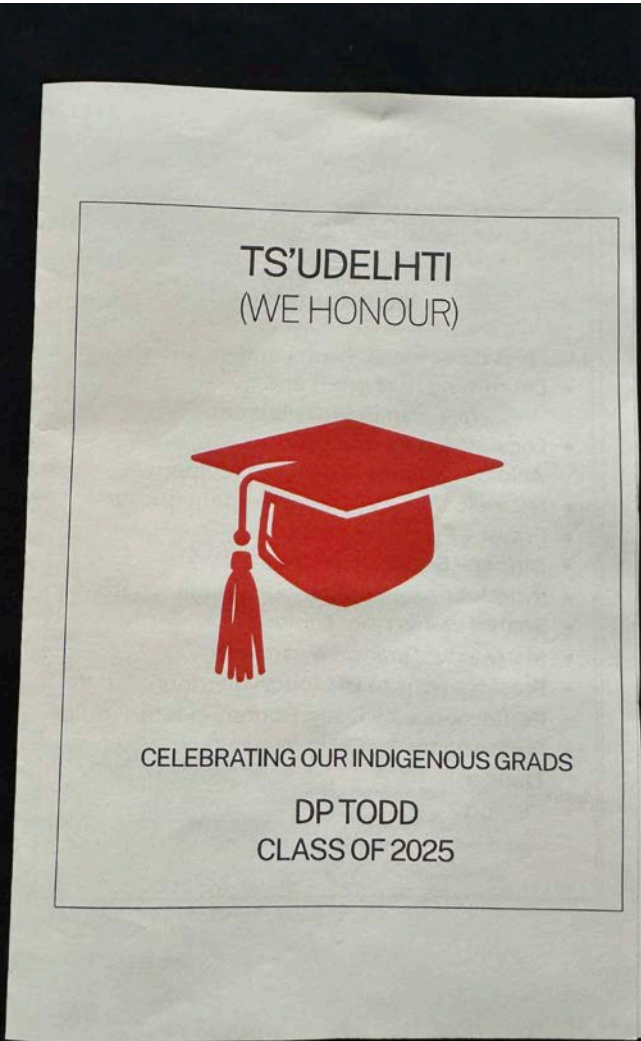

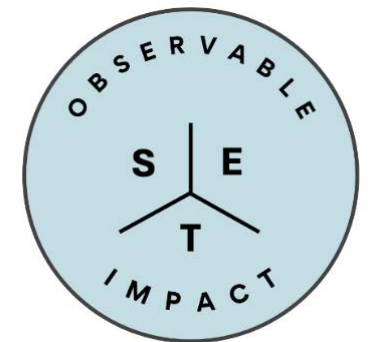


LEARNING
